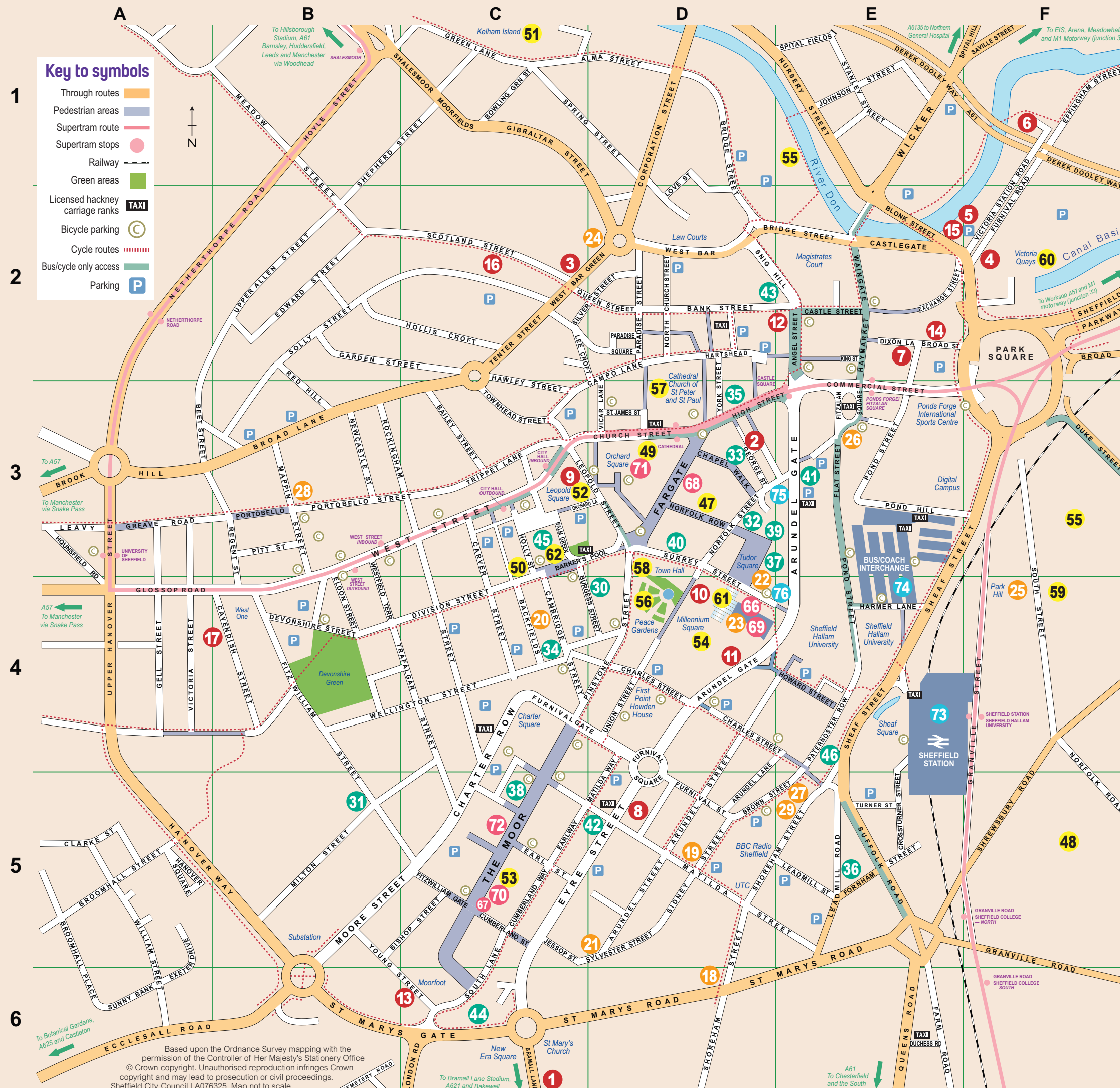

73	E4 Sheffield Train Station The city's main portal into UK rail travel. Includes ticket office, ticket machine, toilets, live departure boards, First Class Lounge. Connects with Supertram network, serviced with a tram stop.
74	E3 Sheffield Bus Interchange and Coach Station Includes live departure screens, information kiosks and a dedicated customer service information desk, located opposite WHSmiths, open 7am-11pm Monday to Sunday. Also includes National Express ticket office open, 7am to 7pm Monday to Saturday.
75	E3 Arundel Gate Interchange Mini interchange with live departure screens, information kiosks and ticket machines.
76	D4 Sheffield Central Library Useful for local information, open Monday to Saturday 0114 273 4712. Graves Art Gallery is also located within the building.

47	D3 Cathedral Church of St Marie's Sheffield's Catholic cathedral built in 1850. A place of historical interest full of fine carving, sculptures and stained glass windows. Tours are available.	55	F3 Park Hill An imposing city landmark - the largest Listed structure in Europe and one of the world's foremost examples of brutalist architecture, recently regenerated by Urban Splash.
48	F5 Cholera Monument Grade 2 listed monument commemorating the 1832 cholera epidemic. Located on a fantastic viewpoint overlooking the city.	56	D4 Peace Gardens Beautiful award winning public space, located next to Sheffield Town Hall, with lawn, fountains, cascades and water features. Close to Millennium Square and the Winter Garden.
49	D3 Cutlers' Hall Grade II* listed building, the Headquarters of the Company of Cutlers in Hallamshire and one of the finest livery halls in the North of England. Tours available on request.	57	D3 Sheffield Cathedral Also known as the Cathedral Church of St Peter and St Paul. One of five Grade I listed buildings in the city, some bits of the church date back to the 13th century.
50	C3 Gold Post Box Located on the edge of Barks Pool. Painted by Royal Mail to celebrate Sheffield's World Champion heptathlete, Jessica Ennis' 2012 Olympic gold win.	58	D4 Sheffield Legends Walk of fame with plaques honouring famous people from the city such as Sean Bean, Jarvis Cocker, Helen Sharman and Michael Palin. Located outside Sheffield Town Hall.
51	C1 Kelham Island One of Sheffield's oldest manufacturing districts, home to Kelham Island Museum, numerous award winning pubs and a host of exciting indie coffee houses and restaurants.	59	F4 South Street Park Landscaped park, including an amphitheatre carved into the hillside. Accessible from the back of the train Station, linking access to Park Hill and the Cholera monument.
52	D3 Leopold Square A cluster of restaurants set amongst the stunning architecture of the former Sheffield Boys School. Live music is played in the square most weekends throughout the summer.	60	F2 Victoria Quays A large canal basin, originally constructed in 1816 as the terminus of the Sheffield and Tinsley Canal. Now an attractive cobbled waterside space with café and pub.
53	C5 Moor Market Modern, indoor farmers' market selling organic meat, fruit and vegetables, with artisan food stalls.	61	D4 Winter Garden One of Sheffield's most iconic landmarks and Europe's largest urban glass house. Home to over 2,500 plants from around the world, creating a tropical oasis in the heart of the city.
54	D4 Millennium Square A modern city square linking the Winter Garden with the Peace Gardens. Overlooked by the iconic Cheesegrater car park building and a host of fantastic restaurants.	62	C3 Women of Steel statue Women of Steel is an iconic bronze sculpture that commemorates the women of Sheffield who worked in the city's steel industry during World War I and World War II.
